Emergency Drill Expectations

Emergency Drill Goal: Students will participate in emergency procedures and drills in a safe, serious and orderly manner.

Individual teachers may have more restrictive rules, but never less restrictive.

Emergency Procedures Expectations

- During the first week of school, all emergency procedures will be taught and practiced.

Fire/Evacuation/Bomb Drills

- Students will walk quietly and quickly out of the building, following the adult in charge.
- Classes will follow the appropriate path to their designated spot.

Severe Weather Drills

- Students will walk quietly to the hallway, following the adult in charge.
- Classes will follow the appropriate path to their designated spot.
- Students will sit on knees with heads down.
- Students will stay in this position until an adult tells them to sit up.
- Students walk quietly back to their classroom.

Earthquake Drills

- At the appropriate time, students will get under their desk or table, protecting their heads.

- Students will return to their seats when the teacher instructs them to do so.

Lockdown Drills

- Students will quietly and quickly follow the directions of the adult in charge.

Encouragement Procedures

- Teachers will consistently encourage responsible behavior through positive interactions. Teachers are responsible for encouraging/praising responsible, respectful behavior.
- Tiger paws may be awarded to a class for following directions and doing a quality job during any of these drills.

Consequences for Infractions

When a student misbehaves, calmly and consistently implement the most appropriate consequence.

- Verbal reprimand/reminder
- Timeout in designated area
- Use office referral only for dangerous behavior, destructive acts or overt insubordination.
